**Dr. Candace S. Vancko to Speak at Extension Annual Meeting  
and Harvest Dinner**

The Board of Directors of Cornell Cooperative Extension Schoharie and Otsego Counties will conduct its annual business meeting and harvest dinner on Thursday, November 17, 6:00 p.m. at Champlin Hall Lounge, SUNY Cobleskill. Dr. Candace S. Vancko, Officer-in-Charge, SUNY Cobleskill and President, SUNY Delhi, will present the keynote remarks. The public is invited to attend the event; reservations are requested by November 9.

Dr. Vancko will speak about her dual role as CEO for two state educational institutions and her vision of the two colleges in the future. She has been president at Delhi since June 1999 and was appointed as Officer-in-Charge at Cobleskill on August 17, 2011. Dr. Vancko earned her B.A. and M.A from Pennsylvania State University and her Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration from Ohio University.

The harvest dinner will feature seasonal, locally produced foods prepared by SUNY Cobleskill Auxiliary Services Catering. The cost is \$22 per person.
